to authorize the issue of the
Exchequer Bills and the advance
of money out of the consolidated
fund for a limited amount, &c

great Britain in various towns
Urbanities, and the several Acts
Subsequently passed for amending
and continuing same, and
authorizing further issues of
Exchequer Bills of the other part,
relating to the Poor Rates of this
Union to be done to John Stoddard
Buckwood Esq Secretary to the
Exchequer Bill Loan Commission of
Public Works to the sum of
£100 - having been read.

Read the following Collection
the Poor Law Commission
No. 21 of 1845 dated 15th February 1845
in
The Poor Law Commission
have had under their consideration
the Resolution passed at the
meeting of the Guardians of the
Luan Union in the 20th ultimo
to

to the effect that no warrants to
collectors of Poor Rates to collect the
Rates be signed until the returns
are perfected by the Collectors and
that certificates, appropriate to the
warrants to the Collectors also had
perfected the same being required.
The Comptroller having at the
same time ~~revised~~ ^{reviewed} the preceding
drafts adopted in reference to the
collection of the Rates in the same
Union, after careful consideration
of all the circumstances seemed it
to be their duty to cause an
application to be made to the
Court of Queen's Bench, to make
absolute the conditional order,
which had been obtained against
the Guardians in the last Term.

The pursuance of this
application ^{to} conditional order
was made absolute on the 27th
ultimo.

The writ of Mandamus will
accordingly be served upon the
Board

Board of Guardians at their next
meeting - The Comptroller also
declines at the same time of stating
that provided warrants be issued to these
Collectors, also leave perfected their
Returns, and such other steps taken
as may be necessary to ensure
the collection of the Rates without
delay, no further proceedings will
be had in reference to the writ.
