to place the Quam Workhouse Schools in
connexion with the National Board of Education

set forth in the forms furnished. If the Schools
are not placed under the National Board, these

Resolved - That Pat Mlynns Tender for making a Bin for Meal at £2.0.0 be accepted.

Resolved - That Mich^l Monaghans proposal to make a Cart for carrying Fever Patients to Ballygaddy at £2.15.0 be accepted.

Resolved - That the proposal of Tho^s McDonough of Castlegrave to take the whole of the broken Stones in that immediate locality at 1/2 per Box be accepted on condition that the amount be handed to Clerk, previous to removing the Stones - Also the proposal of Mr Jennings to take the Stones at Donpool for 1/2 per Box be accepted.

Ordered - That the Clerk invite Tenders by hand-Bills for the broken Stones in the several Electoral Divisions - Tenders to state the amount per Box, and the quantity required by each person tendering, and to be considered at Meeting on 25th Instant.

The Vice Guardians having had under their consideration the incorrect manner in which Mr Pat Glynn Relieving Officer for Donapatrick Electoral Division had kept his accounts, the Classification in the Relief List being inaccurate, and he having granted relief to several classes, which had been distinctly ordered to be discontinued by the Vice Guardians. In addition to these circumstances the Vice Guardians having on several occasions had reason to complain of the slovenly and negligent manner in which Glynn had performed his duties, and no improvement whatever having taken place, and Mr Glynn still attributing his neglect to ignorance of his duties. Resolved - That Mr Glynn be called on for his Resignation which he refused to give, and the Vice Guardians then suspended him and impounded his Books and Accts, and appointed Mr J. W. Gore Relieving Officer for Quarn to take charge of the Donapatrick Electoral Division until some other arrangement could be made.

The Vice Guardians having had under consideration the subject of Pat Cunningham's resignation of the office of Collector

Resolved - That the Clerk call the attention of the Poor Law Commissioners to the fact of Cunningham's not having yet tendered his resignation to the Vice Guardians, and that the Collection for that Division is at a stand still in consequence.
