Resolved that the Tender of Martin Clonan of Inman to supply the Work House with Best Quality Whole Meal at the rate of £18: 2: 6 per ton. Carriage free for three months be accepted. His securities Mr. Murphy & Michel Mitchell both of Inman were not objected to - ✓

The Guardians having decided that their Contract for milk should be taken for 12 months Examined the three Tenders received. Resolved that the Proposal of Messrs. Ryan and Kelly both of Inman to supply best quality Sweet Milk at 6<sup>cts</sup> per Imperial gal. for twelve months be accepted. Their securities Patrick Connors of Banna & Patrick Ryan of Bolykeigh were not objected to ✓
