Letter from Mr. James Mc Dermott, of Rahmone stating
that as far as he was concerned he was quite willing
that ten perches of land be given for enlargement of the
grave yard at Bloughanower, and that he had written to
the tenant on the subject, who states that he would not like
to give the land without compensation, and that the Board may
have special powers in the matter.

The Proprietor having laid before the Board a sketch
of the grave yard of Killerin, and the quantity of land
required for enlargement, the subject having been considered
and Mr. John Nolan having explained his interview with
the Proprietor in respect to compensation, Mr. Robert Henry
was requested to meet Mr. Hanly the proprietor, and make
him an offer of 25 years purchase at £5. per acre for the
quantity of land that may be taken for the purpose of
enlarging the grave yard at Killerin.

The Clerk having stated that it would be necessary
to open a separate Account with the Treasurer in
respect to expenditures to meet the orders of the Council
Boards, the following Minutes were agreed to.

sum of One Hundred pounds for account of the

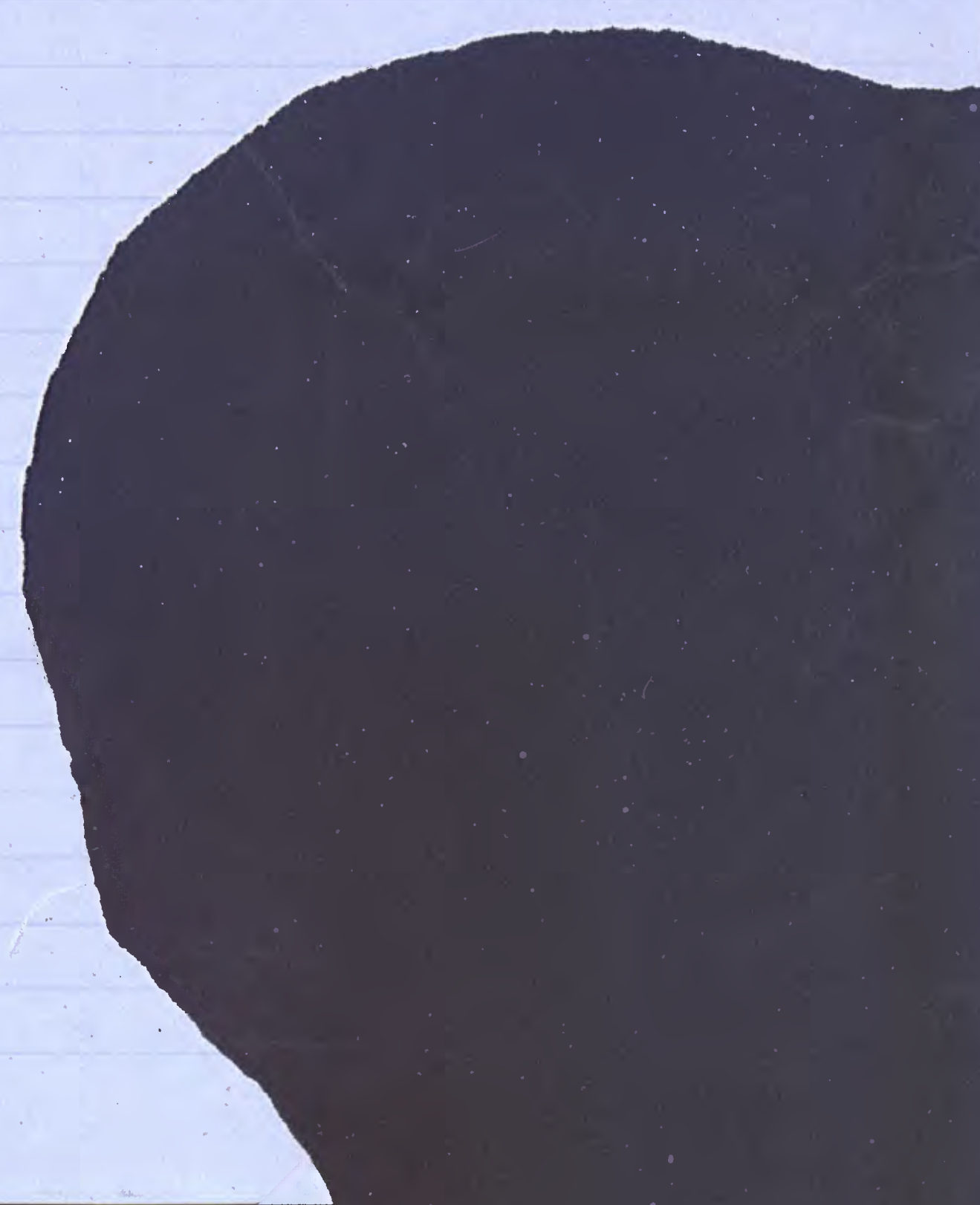

Gentlemen.

In Compliance with your order I inspected the Dummore Graveyard and have to report that it is pretty crowded with graves. Over the greater part of it they are in juxtaposition scarcely any interval between them. There is a small portion of the Graveyard where there are a few vacant spaces. I have never been present at a burial so can't say what depth of soil there may be, but from information gathered I find there are several graves which have not been opened for over 50 years and no doubt there are many which may not be opened for as long more. Where there have been too frequent interments I am informed that there has been some difficulty in procuring a sufficient supply quantity of earth to cover the Coffins and in some recent cases

the interments were almost indecent, However it has been pointed out to me that even in these cases if the people acted with intelligence this defect could have been remedied.

From all I can learn there would be some additional accommodation necessary to give room for strangers as also to allow people having graves there before to open new ones if required but I fear they will not avail themselves of it in the latter case—

I am aware that there was no record of the Board empowering me to take the additional opinion, but I did so for the safety of the Board, and I believe that the Guardians, the facts being before them, will consider the expenditure was not an injudicious one.

 " That a Committee of nine Members was appointed by the Board to select a site for a Burial Ground, six of whom voted for Faranabor, one for Partmore, one for Halfstraddle, and one for Bloomnassagh. At a subsequent Meeting of the Committee directed to be held by the Board seven Members being present, six voted for Faranabor, and one (the Chairman) voted for Partmore, the site of ~~Halfstraddle~~ ^{Halfstraddle} being totally unrecognized. This action of the Committee was endorsed by the Board. The site of Faranabor can be fixed at a sufficient distance from the Workhouse, and as there is no limestone found beneath the surface at least to the depth of eight feet
 at

a special test of it has shown, It cannot be correct to state that wells can be polluted by drainage from Faranabor from limestone fissures. There is only one solitary well behind Faranabor and that a very small one, and that at a distance of fully 275 yards. The suburb of which Dr Turner speaks is not supplied by this well, there are other wells in the immediate neighbourhood which have no connection whatever with Faranabor, and the supply of water from this small well is only a minute portion of the water to which he must have alluded and is of a bad description and the source of the well and all are dried up nearly half each year. As to Halfstraddle there are wells of a very superior description from which the greater portion of the town of Tuam takes water for drinking purposes. One of these it is now yet known to be dry, and this would be more likely to be polluted by a Burial ground than the well behind Faranabor, it is, as are others on the lands of Halfstraddle. It is very objectionable to have funerals pass through the streets narrow like those of Tuam, which must be the case if a site is selected at the Northern side where less than one tenth of the population reside, and where a Burial place is within less than two miles of the Town.

Gentlemen,

In compliance with the request of your Board we beg to state, that accompanied by your Consulting Sanitary Officer and some of the Guardians, we visited and carefully examined the sites which have been reported on by your Committee as being suitable for a Cemetery, in Parkmore, Kalfstraddle, and Haranabon, and we now submit our views on the subject.

With regard to Kalfstraddle, we considered it unnecessary to visit this locality, as its distance from Tuam renders its adoption impracticable.

With regard to Parkmore, though in many respects it would appear to be a desirable site, yet from the formation of the ground, and its proximity to the river Namaf to which it inclined, we consider its selection

selection would be injudicious for sanitary reasons in as much as the water from this river is largely used by the inhabitants of the town for domestic purposes.

As to Halptradelle, we beg to state that we are unable to recommend it for the following reasons.

1^{stly} Its distance from the town - nearly a statute mile, and the hilly nature of the approach would render it inconvenient for the burial of poor people.

2^{ndly} The character of the soil is such as to render the digging of Graves a difficult operation. We examined several trial pits which were dug to a depth of some six feet, and we found that the strata consisted of hard Gravel interspersed with a large quantity of boulders.

3^{rdly} The inclination of the ground towards the river Namoy being so considerable, it would be necessary to restrict the land for a Cemetery to a long, narrow strip along the public road, which would be both unsightly and expensive.

4^{thly} Were this locality selected for a Cemetery it would necessitate the passage through the principal street of the town, of about seven eighths of the funerals, which we consider most objectionable.

In relation to Faranabor, we have no hesitation in saying that we consider it a most eligible site for a Cemetery. It is situated at a convenient distance from the town - about half a statute mile - the road leading to it is good with a gentle incline, and the soil is admirably adapted for the purpose. The trial

trial pits showing tenacious clay to a depth of ten feet, with no appearance whatever of rock or boulders. The selection of this site would relieve the principal street of the town from the passage of about seven eighths of the number of funerals - a most desirable object to attain. It has been stated by the Consulting Sanitary Officer "that wells exist in this locality used by the people of the town which from fissures in the rocks might be affected by drainage from the Cemetery".

We regret that we cannot agree with Dr. Turner in those statements. We have examined the locality very minutely, and we also made all necessary inquiries but were unable to discover any wells in the vicinity of Faranabor. The trial pits have shown there is no rock, and consequently there can be no fissures, on the contrary the soil consists of stiff tenacious clay.

At a considerable distance from the site proposed, there is one small well on an opposite incline and the ground slopes down from it towards Faranabor. This well is rarely used by anyone. Its water is derived from an opposite direction, and between it and Faranabor is a considerable depression, and also the Railway. Any one who examines the locality must see that it is physically impossible that this well would in any way whatever be affected by a Cemetery at Faranabor.
